The Royal Canadian Mint has slated a new one-cent Canadian coin for 1982. The coin has been modified from a circle piece to twelve sided polygon to facilitate coin identify by the blind. The 1982 Canadian Commemorative Silver Dollar will be a centennial by the city of Regina, Saskatchewan. The design will feature a bison Skull superimposed over the Saskatchewan Legislative Building.

The shrinking Canadian dollar may soon disappear completely. Plans are under way to scrap the deflated bill and replace it with a new \$1 coin.

Pressure from transit authority and vending machine operators are the reason behind the move; possibly leading to \$2 coin in circulation at later date.

Effective April 1, James Caldwell Corkery will be Master of Royal Canadian Mint. The former Deputy Postmaster General of the Canadian Post Office replaces Yvon Gariepy who resigned as Master of Mint in December, 1981.

Rumor has it there is a specially minted dollar commenerating Queen's visit to Canada for Constitution. Queen on the observe and Fathers of Conferation on reverse to be distributed to public on July 1st.

Marines and Gurkhas are now well within range of the main airfield five kilometres (three miles) outside Port Stanley. Members of the Seventh Gurkha Rifles are also flying out daily in helicopters to clear pockets of Argentines missed in last week's British advance eastward from the San Carlos beachhead.

British military analysts have said the British position puts the airfield

within artillery range, making it all but impossible for Argentine planes to fly in more men or supplies.

But a Reuter dispatch last night from the British front line near Port Stanley made clear that the British still are not in total control of the land or air space around the capital.

Although speaking of "aggressive patrolling by paratroops" and "a powerful assault force being formed into a line of battle like a jigsaw puzzle," the dispatch revealed that Argentine transport planes are still landing at Port Stanley.

Proud to be . . . stamped in U.S.

The thousands of coins handed out at the Ontario Government's recent constitution celebration that proclaim "We're Proud to be Canadians" on one side were actually stamped in the United States.

Although the 20,000 coins (at a total cost of \$10,740) were made in Ontario, they were stamped in Rochester, N.Y.

Liberal Don Boudria (Prescott-Russell), who raised the matter in the Legislature yesterday, called it a blatant breach of the province's Buy Canadian policy.

"How can the Government preach a Buy Canadian policy to its citizens when something so symbolic as the coins which proclaim pride in Canada were stamped in

the States?" Mr. Boudria asked reporters.

"The value is rather inconsequential. It is the principle that is important. It is silly for the coins to say 'We're Proud to be Canadian' when you allow that kind of non-sense."

Industry Minister Gordon Walker told the Legislature that the Government did not have time to have the coins produced and that the Ontario firm, Viceroy Mint Co., with the help of the U.S. firm, Metal Arts Co., were the only ones that could finish them in time.

"They (the Government officials) thought it was better to have the coins in time for the event rather than several weeks thereafter."

New Democrat James Foulds said, "You had 115 years to get ready."

Government Services Minister Douglas Wiseman said that most of the money spent in producing the coins was spent in Canada. The cost of stamping the coins in the United States was only about two cents each.

The original French-language coins were stamped with a spelling mistake using "le" in place of "de." Mr. Wiseman said the French-language coins were corrected and that the early ones with the spelling mistake have become a collector's item, going for as much as \$15 in some quarters.



In recent ads the UCM has offered for sale 1923 Philadelphia Mint Silver Peace Dollar and Silver Rand well above the going price.

Research carefully what you are buying before entering into an agreement of sale with UCM or any other organization with a special deal, limited time offer.

In conclusion, Coin Clubs should speak out against these pressure sales organizations and inform newspapers who carry these ads how these offers can deceive the uninformed public.
