

The Royal Candian Mint has sent their order forms for 1984 Olympic coins on behalf of the U.S. Mint. The Olympic 1983 Silver Dollar is \$40.00. The Olympic Coins are also available at the Royal Bank branches; with 10 day delivery.

Canada Post President, Michael Warren recently stated, "If you wish indemnity, you may send your numismatic items by first class mail and register them, if their value is \$100.00 or less. If the value is over \$100.00 you must use the money packet rate.

The 5th Edition (1984) of Coins of Canada by J.A. Haxby and R.C. Willey has been released. Coins of Canada is a complete onevolume library of Canadian decimal coins, tokens, and paper money including major varieties. The coinage and tokens of all provinces before Confederation is included as well as Northwest Territories and French Regime. Retailing at \$3.50 (Cdn.) the book is available through bookstores or your local coin dealer or collectors.

A first for the United Kingdom is the striking of a one pound coin. The pound piece is slightly larger than our Canadian 10¢ coin. As it is not popular with the people, it may suffer the same demise as the Susan B. Anthony dollar of the U.S.A.
