The Royal Canadian Mint has introduced a first in Canadian coinage by marking the word "Canada" on the edge of the 1983, \$100.00 gold coin. Many years ago this was done as security lettering by minters as a means of discouraging com counterfeiting attempts. Today it is regarded as a technique for enhancing a coin's esthics and adding visual interest. Mintage will be limited to 200,000.

Numismatic News

Coin Week Canada will be held from April 15 to 21, 1984. The theme this year is "Numismatics- A Foundation For Friendship", relating to the role coin collecting can portray in developing new friendships. (Plans are in the works for setting up displays at two malls in the city during Coin Week 1984).

The Royal Canadian Mint not only produces two different dollar coins for 1982, but two varieties of the fifty cent piece as well. The two varieties are called Type I, High Relief, Large Beads (118) ans Type II, Low Relief, Small Beads (123).

The mintage, distribution and relative scarcity of 1982 Type I and Type II fifty cent pieces is not known, but Type II seems to be scarcer.

The paper pound in Britain is still alive and well and living in the U.K. as there is heavy opposition to a metal pound being struck.

Isle of Man has released a new plastic one pound banknote with a life expectancy of 5 to 15 years. Paper notes wear out after an average of 9 months. Haiti is the only other nation currently issuing plastic banknotes. The Bank of England is studying the matter closely, as their notes only last 6 to 7 months.

Perhaps the United States and Canada will consider the same course.

Numismatic News: The first commercial use of aureate-steel, a golden bronze alloy banded on all sides to a steel core, will be for the 1984 Grande Prairie trade dollar. Aureate-steel was developed and tested by Sherritt Mint at Fort Saskatchewan.

The 25 percent Canadian flax content on Canadian paper currency will

soon be replaced by 100 percent cotton from U.S.A.

This decision was brought about by environmental considerations as chem-

icals used in the process of the flax was affecting nearby river systems.

Also, on the topic of paper money, there will be a new signature variety on the seven circulating denominations. Deputy Governor William Lawson will be retiring and his replacement will be John W. Crow.

SHOW EXHIBIT RULES AND REGULATIONS.

REGISTRATION:

Displays must be registered by 2:00 pm on the day of the show. There will be a \$1.00 charge for each exhibit registered. Exhibitors have the right to choose a suitable category for their exhibits, but may only enter one display per category. Once an exhibit has been registered, it cannot be changed or transferred to another category. No identifying marks other than registration numbers may appear on or near the exhibit.

GENERAL:

An exhibitor does not have to be a member of the Edmonton Coin Club. Exhibits must consist only of items which are exclusively the bona fide property of the registered exhibitor. The number of cases making up one display must be recorded with the Display Chairman. Persons wishing to remove their exhibit(s) before the close of the show must have the permission from the Committee Chairman.

JUDGING:

Decisions of the judges will be final and will not be open to scrutiny by anyone other than the Display Committee. The Committee will verify points awarded to each display and establish the winner in each category. However, the judges may, at their discretion and for the improvement of exhibitors of future exhibits, make verbal comments, but shall not be required to do so.

A display must earn 80 to 100 points to qualify for first prize, 65 points or more for second prize, and 50 points or more for third prize. Awards receiving 65 or more points may be awarded honorable mentions at the discretion of the judges. The above point system shall not apply to junior exhibits.

The junior category is open to anyone 16 years and younger. Their exhibit may consist of any numismatic material, and, if desired, may be entered in any other suitable category.

The novice award is open to those competitors who have never won a prize in any coin show exhibition. The winner may come from any category.

The Court of Honor is restricted to displays which have won first prize in any previous show.

Best of Show: the winner may not enter the same display in subsequent years, the exception being the Court of Honor. The first prize winners in all categories, except Court of Honor, are eligible to win Best of Show.

SECURITY:

Security will be provided during the show and overnight, however, it is the responsibility of each exhibitor to ensure that their displays are properly hinged and secured, preferably locked. Also, no liability shall be attached to the Edmonton Coin Club, its officers or its members, either in their official or individual capacities, due to the theft of, or loss of, or damage to any material placed on exhibit.

1985.

U.S. Treasury is in process of designing changes to American paper currency to make it more difficult for counterfeiters to duplicate.

Options considered are incorporating pastel coloured designs, similar to those on Canadian currency; or running a "security thread" vertically on a side margin of the bill. The thread could be seen only when held up to the light, but not visible when laying flat. One other option would be use of a hologram on a section of the bill, high powered laser beam actually carves a design into the bill. The currency change would be the first for the U.S. since 1929, when current bills replaced much larger bills known as "horse blankets".
