The Strathcona Foundation is in the process of publishing a Club Directory. Terry Cheesman, one of our members is working with the Foundation as Club spokesperson. From this the Club should get further exposure to possible new members.

NUMISMATIC NEWS: Dack's Shoe Stores have commemorated their 150th Anniversary by minting a nickel bonded steel trade token.

This token was valid at all Dack's Shoe stores across Canada. Total mintage was 24,000 with 500 being gold plated. Specimens will be available to collectors after December 15, 1984 at a nominal prices of \$1.85 for regular and \$8.50 for the gold plated.

The Royal Mint has announced Canada's 1985 Silver Dollar and \$100.00 Gold Coin will both feature the centennial of the founding of the first National Park. The silver dollar will feature a moose standing in water with trees and mountains in the background. The legend will read "National Parks 1885-1985 Parcs Nationaux". The obverse will feature the usual effigy of Queen Elizabeth. The \$100.00 gold coin will feature a big horn sheep on a cliff with the legend "1885 National Parks, Parcs Nationaux 1985" and denomination 100 dollars maximum mintage will be 200,000.

For the first time in history Yugoslavia hosted an Olympic competition and to mark this occasion another first, the first Olympic commemorative gold coin ever to be issued by a Winter Games host nation. A maximum mintage of only 55,000, half for the host country and half for numismatic collectors. The coin is available from Paramount International Coin Corp. P.O. Box 569003, Miami, Florida (33256-9003) for \$246.00 each, 5000 Dinar Gold. .900 fine gold. Proof coin. Diameter 24mm, weight 123.46 grams, cased and certificate.

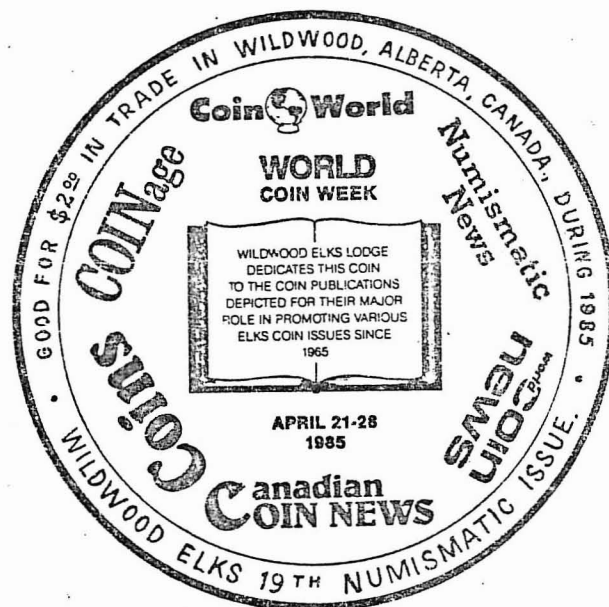

Numismatic News: World Coin Week 1985, April 21 - 28, is commemorated on a 38mm \$2.00 trade dollar valid at participating merchants in the town of Wildwood, Alberta until the end of this year.

The token was designed by numismatist Nick Myschuk of Wildwood. Pressed Metal Products of Vancouver struck the token on 38mm blanks in bronze, brass and nickel-silver. Specimens are available post paid at \$2.50 each, 3 for \$7.00 or 10 for \$20.00 from Wildwood Elks Lodge #411, Box 22, Wildwood, Alberta T0E 2M0. See below picture of trade dollar.



Numismatic Notes: The U.S. Susan B. Anthony dollars are apparently going to be sold by the U.S. Mint at face value. 2000 per bag or smaller lots with purchaser paying shipping costs.

A mystery which boggles the mind is the 1970 gold Manitoba dollar, which was seized by the U.S. Secret Service just hours before it was to be auctioned at the annual convention of the American Numismatic Association in Cincinnati.

Much Pleasure can be derived from collecting trade dollars or tokens and one need not spend large amounts of money in order to obtain pleasure from this hobby.

The Calgary Olympic series of 10 silver dollars and a gold coin will begin this fall.

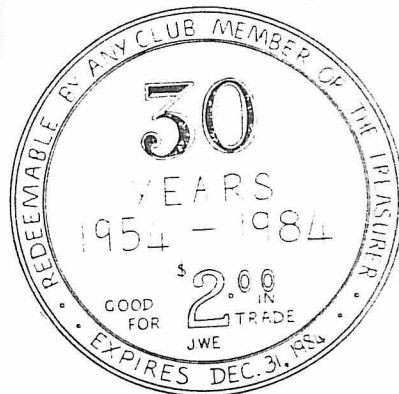
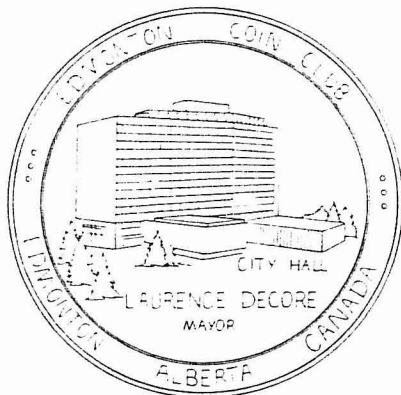

It will be 916 fine (22 karat) gold. NUMISMATIC NOTES: The 1983 dated U.S. Olympic Games silver dollar has been selected the Coin of the Year by Krause Publications. The selection was made by an international panel of 50 mint officials, medalists, numismatics and other experts who chose it from 42 nominated coins issued by nations around the world.

The Royal Canadian Mint intends to strike ten issues of a twenty dollar silver coin containing one ounce of silver and one issue of one dollar gold coins with one-half ounce of gold. The program is to start this fall and continue to 1988.

Isle of Man "Angels" are one ounce and one-tenth of an ounce gold coins, due to the face on the reverse featuring Archangel Michael slaying a dragon.

At a recent U.S. auction a 1947 Canadian fifty cent maple leaf curved seven sold for \$1,292.00.

Bronzing the buck

At a time when you need a dollar just for bus fare, scrapping the Canadian dollar bill makes eminent sense.

Replacing the paper with a bronze-coated, golden-colored coin made of nickel would save the government \$9 million a year and businesses and consumers both time and frustration.

Officials of the Royal Canadian Mint say the new dollar coin would last at least 20 years — paper lasts only a year.

Economists say the move would be “a minor inconvenience”; it wouldn’t shake up the monetary system.

But what of the psychological pain? Canadians who remember nickel sodas and a dollar as a healthy allowance need no more reminders of inflation. Or do we? This metallic memento may provide a handy jolt of economic reality.

Real silver dollars are gone. Now the paper dollar may follow. What’s next? With the lumber industry in the doldrums, maybe they’ll bring back the wooden nickel, only make it worth five dollars.

It’ll really be time to worry when the \$20 bill is replaced with a coin — plastic, no doubt.

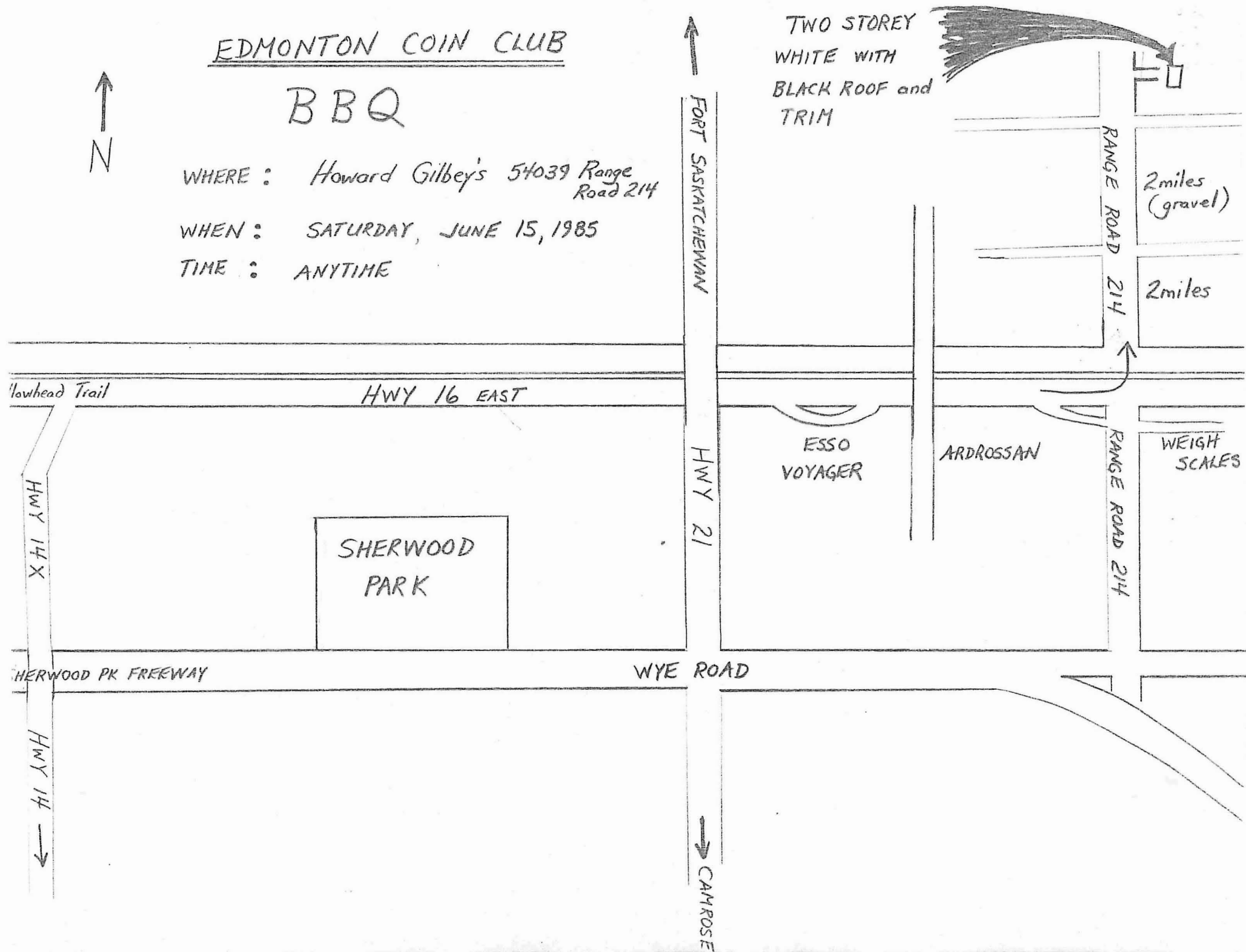

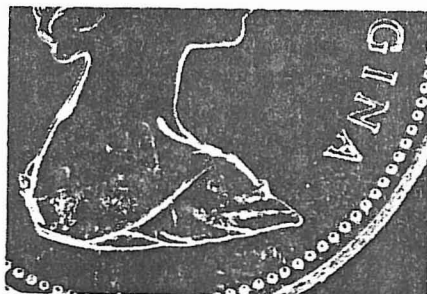

- The curls of the hair are mushy and less sharp.

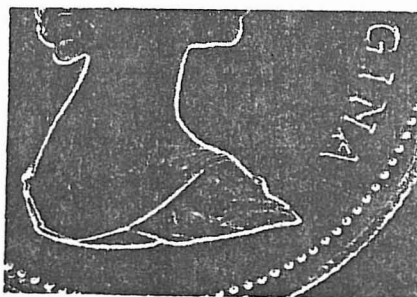
Small Beads

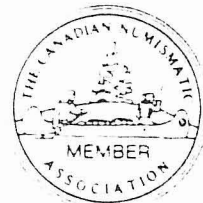
