MAY MEETING MINUTES

May's meeting was held at the Westwood Inn in conjunction with the Edmonton International Coin & Stamp show. Twenty-eight members attended the breakfast with an additional 2 members attending the talks. The breakfast was held in the Oak Room, not our usual room beside the Bourse. Although a little small for the turnout, it made for an excellent area for an informal talk. Our first presentation was by member Reg Smith, who came in from Camrose for our meeting and the show. Reg talked on Nickel in coinage. Nickel was isolated in pure form in 1751. In 1850 the first nickel coin was struck with the nickel alloy in Switzerland. Silver was also mixed into coinage but didn't mix well. In 1860, Belgium came up with the best mix of 25% nickel and 75% copper. In 1881 Switzerland minted pure nickel coinage. Reg brought examples of the various types of coins minted and were passed around to the members to view. After several questions, Terry Cheesman continued with his series of ancient coinage. Terry covered Roman Imperial Coinage from about 150 BC to 400 AD. A small selection of 40 coins was distributed for viewing, covering several topics: Buildings, Animals and Portraits on coinage. A great selection of gold, silver and bronze coinage was shown and once again presented in an educational way for the members enjoyment. Thanks was extended to both members for the enjoyable presentations. A 1993 silver maple leaf was won by Joe Grace. A Communion Token book was won by Hans Buchmueller. Members then attended the bourse.

Our bid for the 1998 CNA convention is underway. The proposal is being prepared by the ENS executive in conjunction with Economic Development Edmonton. Mike met with the EDE last week and they will put a proposal together which will include information we will provide as well as letters of invitation from the Province, City and Tourism Edmonton. In addition we have contacted the Klondike Days Association and they will prepare a letter of welcome on behalf of K-Days, which precedes our proposed show. Deadline for completion of the submission is mid June. This will allow the CNA to send copies to the executive prior to the CNA executive meeting in Montreal in July. Dan Gosling, our Delegate, will be attending the meeting and make an official presentation on behalf of the Club. Possibly following the show, we will have an answer to whether we will be holding the convention or not in 1998.

NUMISMATIC INTERNET NEWS

The Club has had a home page on the internet since Dan set one up in February. Although still under 'construction' as they say, Dan is upgrading it as time permits, and we have to beef up some of the items about the club, but generally we are up and running. To show how effective it can be, we have received a note from a student at the University of New South Wales in Australia, asking for a membership application. They said they had contacted the International Numismatic Society to possibly hold a convention in Edmonton in the next 5 years. A TYPE COLLECTION OF CANADIAN GOVERNMENT \$1.00 BANKNOTES

A type collection of Canadian Government \$1.00 banknotes is an interesting way to put together a small and fairly representative collection of our banknotes, which have been in circulation at various times since Confederation.

To aid the collector form such a collection, an illustrated check list of sixteen types of Canadian Government \$1.00 banknotes in circulation in Canada at various times since Confederation is given at the end of this article.

Catalogues list the 1967 centennial \$1.00 banknote with a normal serial number and those with "1867-1967" in place of the serial number as two varieties of the same type note. Since they are inexpensive, I would advise collectors to add both varieties to their collection.

I have listed the major varieties for some type notes, so that collectors may check off the particular variety they have in their type collection.

The six 19th century \$1.00 type notes in the check list are a bit on the expensive side, so some collectors may not wish to purchase them. However, specimens in good or even very good condition of several of these notes are affordable, if purchased at the rate of one banknote every few years.

My advice is to start a collection of \$1.00 type notes by acquiring the banknotes issued for Queen Elizabeth II and King George VI, in the condition you can afford them. Spread out your purchases and perhaps you can purchase better grade banknotes. Once you have completed the type notes for these two monarchs, acquire specimens of the banknotes issued with the portrait of King George V, and after that continue to acquire notes that were issued previously. Collect your banknotes slowly, so as to get the best condition you can afford.

DEALERS AND AUCTIONS

The sale price of banknotes at an auction is often below catalogue value, so this is a good method of acquiring banknotes. A listing of all pieces to be sold at quite a large number of auctions throughout the year is printed in the pages of Canadian Coin News, avoiding the necessity of having to purchase an auction catalogue. Mail bids are encouraged.

A catalogue covering Canadian Government banknotes describes and illustrates the various varieties for each type note and gives valuations for a number of grades of preservation.

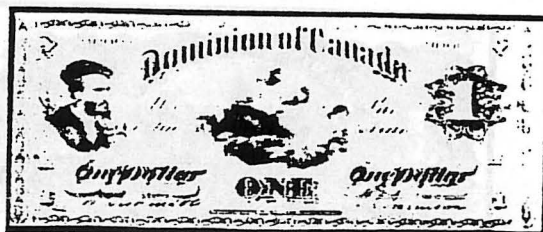

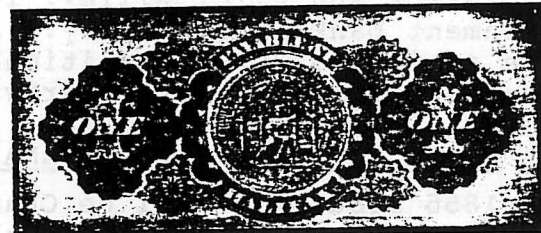

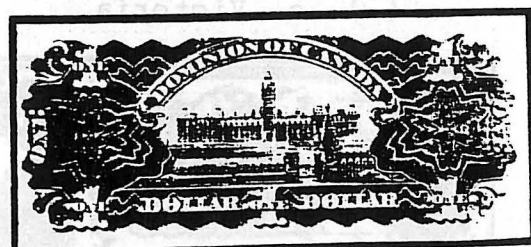

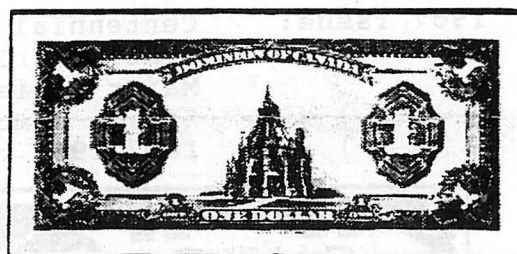

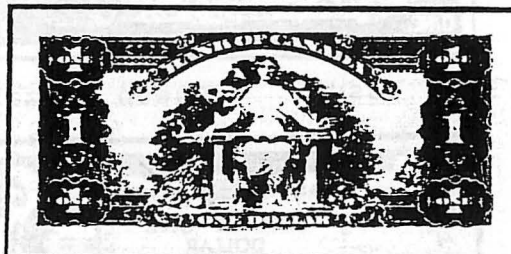

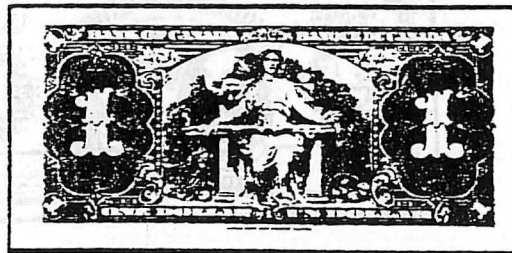
