1. Show update - 23 Coin Dealers & 3 stamp dealers confirmed. We will have a club table, gold, ancient, paper, Coin postcards and other displays to be confirmed. Sunday we will have experts in Can. decimal, Ancient, paper, and world coinage manning tables for the public to bring in items to identify. Dan will bring in a video to run in the front lobby. Hotel will supply VCR & TV. Prizes have been confirmed as a \$100 year 2000 gold coin as well as several other mint

product prizes. Bernie has agreed to provide a portable sign for the club to use. It will be placed where the City will allow us a sign. All the other advertising is in place for newspaper, radio, TV etc. David will be looking after the Top Ten page in the Journal, as well as the Sun ad. Volunteers are still needed to man the front desk & take tickets.

- 10. A book donation to the University has been approved for 2000 in the amount of \$200. Terry will find a suitable book. The club gets recognized as usual.
