SEPTEMBER MEETING MINUTES

The first meeting of the fall was our famous Free Pizza night at the Provincial Museum on Sept. 13th. It was well attended with 34 members and 2 guests present. The three members (Dan, James and Lub) that attended the CNA Convention each gave a talk on the different events that took place. James spoke about the different nightly events that took place each day. He passed around photos of his trip showing the display of Coin Postcards that he had exhibited and of the Mint tour. He also passed around the second place ribbon and medal he received exhibiting his display. The mint tour sounded like it was once in a lifetime experience. The delegate breakfast meeting dealt with how to get more people involved in the CNA at the club level and how to increase membership in the CNA. There was also discussion on putting on more education forums and what was the best medium to view/show the different numismatic subjects that make up the library. Lub spoke of the auction and how with buyers fee and PST, the final cost is 25%

greater than the actual winning bid. There was poor attendance at the auction plus Lub pointed out there were mistakes in the paper money section on the auction catalogue. He gave his insight of the CPMS luncheon, he thought the speakers topic was a little to general and really did not find it that interesting. The CTCCC meeting was really good with prizes up for draw and an auction.

Approx. 30 members after the meeting attended at bar-b-que just outside Ottawa at the member's house. On the last day he was able to enjoy a tour of the Ottawa area. He also mentioned that there is an upcoming major Bank of Canada paper money auction to take place Nov 18th. Dan talked about his experiences from the CNA and ANA conventions and he passed out numerous pieces of numismatic material (posters, booklets, magazines, auction catalogues, etc...), which was enjoyed by all. He also passed out Franklin Mint medallions to the members that he picked up at the ANA. He talked about and passed around the CNA 50th anniversary book that was printed and sold at the CNA along with a medallion and script to celebrate 50 years of the CNA. He talked about how neat it was to pass out his first wood at the CAWMC breakfast meeting and how it is one of the best meetings to attend, as everyone attending passes out a wood and how you end up with quite a collection.
