
CONGRATULATIONS ON 50 YEARS AS AN ASSOCIATION

In numismatic terms, 50 years is a relatively short time. Most numismatic items don't appreciate to a large extent until they are well over 50 years old, unless there is an error or anomaly making it unique or rare. Ancient coins, for example, although several hundred years old, can still be purchased for relatively small sums of money, and this is due in large part to supply and demand. The Edmonton Coin Club, as it was known, was formed 50 years ago by local people wanting to share their hobby. Over the years the club grew, put on Coina-Rama's, Coin Shows, Mini-Coin Shows, held 2 national conventions and more recently has been holding 2 shows per year since about 1996, when we changed our name to the Edmonton Numismatic Society. No mater what you call it, the 'club' has grown and it's members, now numbering over 105, have been meeting, some for decades, each month to share their numismatic interests and their company. These meetings have fostered not only occasional friendships but lifelong bonds between like-minded and sometimes not so like minded individuals. For some members, the regular meetings aren't enough to satisfy their hobby and friendships. It's interesting to see the meetings carry on after the regular meeting is over, at a local pub, with a pint of beer and a few snacks. Here the horse-trading and recent acquisitions come out and are shared with all to view and comment on. This is where the collecting goes beyond a 'hobby' and the true friendships and numismatic bonds flourish. It's a great hobby and there are great people out there that need to be coaxed and prodded to make that once a month commitment. There are also a lot of young people who have to be encouraged and nurtured along with a good deal, to ensure the hobby survives. It doesn't take a rocket scientist to see the hobby getting older each year. When the youngest in the club is in their 30's, and the majority over 50 or 60, we have to keep the younger generation in mind. So when someone like Ron Darbyshire sets up a Kids-on-Coins program and has established clubs in schools, we all need to thank him and others like him, and provide them as much support as possible. That's why the club has supported the project financially and will continue to do so. But Ron is 1 guy and there are a lot of schools and kids out there. If you can help out with 1 night a month, or 1 Saturday, you to can add to this great hobby of numismatics, and ensure here are enough of us around to celebrate the 75th and 100th anniversaries of the club. Congratulations and best wishes on the next 50 years.
