In addition to Paul, Bret Evans from Trajan Publishing, Managing Editor of the Canadian Coin News was also sharing a table with Paul. Club members and the public were able to get CNA applications and purchase Numismatic home study courses which were available at the show. In addition to these two, Ron Darbyshire was

manning the **Kids On Coins** table in the front as well. Ron was busy all day talking to kids and their parents, and having them fill in tickets for free draws. Saturday's attendance was the best since the CNA was held in 1998 in Edmonton. The Crowds kept coming in all day long and made for a great day, with many dealers having the best day they've had at our shows, and for some, at any show they've attended.

Advertizing for the show was aptly lead by Kim and David Peter, and resulted in radio and TV people in attendance Saturday. My phone was ringing all day by persons wanting info on the show. The 10 Best in the Edmonton Journal highlighted our show, and this brought the public to the show in droves. Thanks to Trajan Publishing for prompting us for an ad in Canadian Coin News. This was well received by the dealers and brought in a lot of collectors. Alberta weeklies, local papers and Antique gazettes were also highlighting our show. Following Saturday's show, fifty-six (56) members and guests met in the Edmond room for our 50th Anniversary Banquet. A cash bar was set up and those in attendance enjoyed the company of others throughout the evening. President Dan Gosling welcomed all in attendance and thanked the organizing committee for a job well done. The club had 2 special guests in attendance; our guest speaker, Bret Evans, Managing Editor, Trajan Publishing, as well as Paul Petch, Editor for the CNA Journal. Paul was asked to say a few words about the CNA and he thanked Dan for his hospitality while in Edmonton. Bret Evans was introduced and spoke on many anecdotes and recollections since getting into reporting on numismatics with Trajan Publishing. He has attended many conventions and shows across Canada and the US, and has met many interesting and notable figures in the hobby. Having once worked and lived in Alberta, Bret still visits family in St. Albert and thanked us for our hospitality. He indicated the Edmonton show doesn't have to take a back seat to any show in Canada, and is one of the best he's attended. Following Bret's talk, Dan presented our 50th Anniversary Gold plated medallions to the Executive members in attendance, as well as to past presidents Reg Smith (1963 & 1973) and Howard Gilbey (1977). In addition, our special guests, Bret and Paul were presented with our Gold plated medallions. Following the banquet, those in attendance were invited to the Club's hospitality suite in the hotel, where we were joined by several dealers staying in the hotel. Numismatic discussions continued till midnight, when it was decided to re-convene in the morning. Sunday's Bourse was open at 10:00 am to the usual lineup. Attendance for Sunday's is usually slower than Saturday, but the collectors came in quite strong this day as well. A special gold plated Anniversary medallion was presented to another past president, Vic Kaminsky (1967 & 1968), who is a dealer at our shows. Additional media were at the show Sunday, and a photo was inserted in the Edmonton Sun on Monday, showing dealer George Manz holding a chinese cash coin.

Edmonton Numismatic Society 50th Anniversary Medallion for Sale





In commemoration of the 50th Anniversary of the ENS, the club has struck a bimetallic medallion. The medallion, pictured above, is minted on a 32.04 mm Bi-metallic blank, produced in Mexico. The outer ring is a copper-nickel alloy (brass) and has the words "Celebrating 50 Years" on the obverse, and "Edmonton Numismatic Society 1953 – 2003" on the reverse. The obverse copper-aluminum-nickel centre core has the Alberta coat of Arms with a stylized 'coin' in the centre, with '50' on the face of the coin. A 'maple leaf' and 'fireworks' straddle the ring and the core on the obverse as well. The core of the reverse, has the Edmonton Numismatic Society's logo of a "pick, shovel and gold pan" full of gold nuggets shown. The weight of each coin is 15.995 grams, and the thickness is approximately 2.73 mm. The medallion was minted at the Great Canadian Mint in Edmonton. This similar reverse design was used at our 1998 CNA convention, which commemorated Edmonton's participation as the 'Gateway' to the north during the gold rush of 1898. The number of medallions issued is 250 Bi-metallic, plus 50 gold plated. The gold plated issues were only available to club members and special guests, and are sold out. It is one I will keep and be proud of for a long time. The count at the front door for kids was I think an all time high at over 129. The Kids on Coins table was a very busy place from the time the doors opened until the close Sunday night. FIRST COINS OF KURDISTAN





The Kurds are an ethnic group divided between Iraq, Turkey, Syria and Iran. For centuries they have dreamed of having an independent homeland, however each time the dream has been thwarted. An independent Kurdistan was promised after World War I, however instead their land was divided between Turkey and Iraq. After the First Gulf War in 1991 the Kurds in Iraq were granted a large degree of autonomy under the United Nations. They even used a different currency than the rest of Iraq, called the Swiss Dinar. Many Kurds in Iraq were expecting to gain full independence with the fall of Saddam Hussein in 2003. Several overseas Kurdish groups authorized the issuance of coins for what they expected would be a new independent nation after the fall of Saddam. However, the Turks feared that an independent Kurdistan in Iraq would further the demands of the Kurds within Turkey for more autonomy. They strongly objected to an autonomous Kurdistan within Iraq and threatened an invasion. The United States agreed with Turkey, so plans for an independent Kurdistan have once again been quashed. The first coins however were still issued. The coins feature the Kurds historic past and wildlife native to their homeland. The 1 Dinar showing the most famous Kurd of all time, Saladin. Salidin founded the powerful Ayyubid dynasty and ruled from 1169 to 1193. His diplomatic skills, backed by well-disciplined army enabled him to gain control of Egypt, Palestine and Syria from Islamic as well as Christian opponents. Even his opponents admired him for his chivalry, justice and piety. The 1 Dinar is struck in bronze-plated zinc, a material similar to that used in the current U.S. cent, has an authorized mintage of only 5,000 pieces. The 10 Dinars coin pictures the native Persian Fallow Deer and has an authorized mintage of only 10,000 pieces. The coin is struck on nickel plated bronze. The silver proof 100 Dinar shows the Lesser Kestrel, a small bird of prey from the Falcon family that is native to Kurdistan. It has an authorized mintage of only 500 pieces. The gold proof 1000 Dinar features Saladin riding a horse carrying a Kurdish flag. It is struck in 22 Karat gold and contains just slighly under a half ounce of pure gold. Only 50 pieces were struck of this attractive gold coin. The 10 Dinar is 39mm (silver dollar size) while the other denominations are 27mm in diameter. Mountains have figured prominently in Kurdish lore, so the reverse of all the coins features four mountain peaks, which also represents the four nations with major Kurdish populations.

Above the mountains is a 21-rayed rising sun, which is a traditional Kurdish symbol predating the nations conversion to Islam. The legends are in the two main dialects of Kurdish: Sorani and Kurmanji. A significant portion of the authorized mintages of the 1 and 10 Dinars are actually being distributed in Iraqi held portions of Kurdistan. The 100 and 1000 Dinars are Proof-only issues, so are not expected to circulate. These are beautiful and intriguing coins coin from a new nation that has yet to be born.

NEW COINS OF SERBIA

The first coins bearing the name of the country Serbia in 60 years have just been issued! During World War II the Nazi's set up Serbia as a puppet state. With the defeat of Germany, Serbia again became a part of Yugoslavia. After the collapse of communism in Europe in 1991, various portions of Yugoslavia, including Slovenia, Croatia, Macedonia and Bosnia-Herzegovina declared independence, until all that was left of Yugoslavia was Serbia and Montenegro. Still they continued to maintain the Yugoslavia name. Montenegro, tired of being dragged down by the economic mismanagement of Serbia, now looks like it will go its own way. Rather than using the unstable Yugoslavian Dinar, most transactions in Montenegro are done in Euros. Facing reality, Serbia issued a new series of coins in 2003. The name Yugoslavia was dropped from the coins, instead the coins bear the symbol and name of the National Bank of Serbia on one side. The other side features famous Serbian architectural monuments. The set consists of the 1, 2, 5, 10 and 20 Dinara coins. They are struck in a copper-nickel-zinc alloy.



NEW COINS OF ARMENIA



In 2003 Armenia released a new series of higher denomination coins. The coins consist of the 20, 50, 100, 200 and bi-metallic 500 Drams. Because of continuing inflation, the <u>previous series of coins</u> issued in 1994 had lost most their purchasing power. The designs are simple, yet attractive. One side of the coins shows the denomination while the other bears the nations arms.


