





C.N.A. Coin Kids Committee

Collectors from across Canada have gone into schools to speak to students about our great hobby. They did an admirable job of getting kids interested in the hobby by telling them about the history and art found in each coin.

Thanks to a group of dedicated collectors who realized there was a group of people speaking to kids, they were put in touch with each other. They compared notes on what each one was doing to promote coin collecting in their respective cities. They all spoke to students in school classrooms and assisted in getting student coin clubs set up and running. With all of them doing the same type of speaking, it was natural for us to start a national program, which is called Coin Kids. The C.N.A.'s coin kids membership has grown from 12 to over 120 in just one short year.

To illustrate the success of the C.N.A.'s Coin Kids Program, the committee's chairman, Ron Darbyshire of Edmonton, Alberta, spoke to over 2,000 students during the 2002/2003 school year. On average, schools invited him back three times to speak to other classes in the school. Topics covered include Canadian tokens, Canadian coins, how coins are works of art, metals used in coins and the Canadian banking system. Ancient Greek, Roman, Egyptian and world coins were also covered. In Edmonton alone, there are a number of school clubs running with more in the planning stages.

A member of the committee, Chris Boyer, has been successful in starting various coin clubs in Guelph and Kitchener, Ontario, as has Fred Freeman in his hometown of Woodstock, Ontario. Other members who have contributed to the success of the program are Geoff Bell of Shediac, New Brunswick, who first appointed a Coin Kids Committee during his tenure as C.N.A. President, and John Regitko, who solicited donations for Coin Kids kits and mailed them to all junior members. The President of The C.N.A. is also a member of the Committee, ex officio.

When a membership application is received from a junior collector, they are automatically mailed a quantity of books, catalogues, back-issues of *The CN Journal* and numismatic collectibles donated by the Royal Canadian Mint, Charlton Press, Canadian Coin News and a number of dedicated collectors and dealers. Because the shipping cost alone is between \$8 and \$10 depending on where it is being shipped, it is obvious that the annual membership of \$16.50 does not cover the Association's cost, especially since the membership also includes the printing and mailing cost of 10 Journals that are sent out during the course of a calendar year.

Young collectors are encouraged to join the C.N.A. at the very attractive rate of \$16.50 for the calendar year 2004. Note that the offer of the free Coin Kids Kit may be withdrawn at any time as donated material becomes exhausted.

ANR to sell Eliasberg world coins in April '05

Almost everyone has long thought that the Eliasberg Collection was history. Turns out that a sizeable part is still intact. Richard Eliasberg retained his father's world coins and has recently consigned them to <u>American Numismatic Rarities</u> of Wolfeboro, N.H. ANR will conduct the auction in April 2005 at the Park Lane Hotel in New York City. The firm of <u>Spink</u> in London will be involved in the sale, and its staff will contribute to the catalog.

Eliasberg's collection includes coins from all over the world, spanning several centuries, plus a few ancients. There are a

large number of high-quality European coins, especially from the 17th through the 19th centuries. Indeed, quite a few pieces are likely to be the finest-known examples of their respective issues. Rare Japanese and Korean coins are among the highlights of the Asian portions of the collection. Patterns and medals from different continents are also included.

The famed Eliasberg Collection included world rarities. Among them is this Hungarian gold 10 ducats of 1703.

Roughly two-thirds of the collection is comprised of coins from Latin America, many of

which were formerly in the Newcomer Collection. Waldo Newcomer, a Baltimore-area banker, formed an incredible collection in the 1920s, including many rarities in U.S. series.

When Newcomer's collection was distributed privately, many of his coins. In 1942, with Stack's acting as an intermeacquired Clapp's coin collection in its entirety.

Most of the superb gem U.S. coins that were in the Elias-

greed to the Clapp Collection. These included many U.S. coins, in all metals, that graded Mint State-66 or Proof-66 or higher. Indeed, more than a few Clapp-Eliasberg coins from the 19th century were eventually graded -68 by Professional Coin Grading Service or Numismatic Guaranty Corp. A small number, including an 1894-S half eagle and an 1845-O dime, were later certified as -69!

As an extensive collection of several denominations, the quality of Clapp's coins is unrivaled in the history of American numismatics. If Clapp's world coins are commensurable in quality to his U.S. coins, then the Clapp-Eliasberg world coins will be a wonder to behold.

Louis E. Eliasberg Jr. inherited his father's U.S. gold coins, and most everything else went to his brother, Richard. In 1982, Bowers and Ruddy Galleries auctioned the U.S gold coins for \$12.4 million. Q. David Bowers was the sole cataloger. Richard Bagg was his research assistant and worked closely with Louis Eliasberg Jr. Also, as an employee of Paramount in the 1970s, Bagg did research for David W. Akers, who wrote several books on U.S. gold coins.

In the mid-1990s, Richard Eliasberg decided to sell his copper, nickel and silver U.S. coins, plus Colonials, patterns and miscellaneous American items. Again, Q. David Bowers was chosen. Two sales were held, one in 1996 that realized \$11.6 million, and another in 1997 that totaled \$20.9 million.

In May 1996, the Eliasberg 1913 Liberty Head nickel became the first coin to sell at auction for more than \$1 million when Jay Parrino paid \$1.485 million. The same coin was sold privately by Dwight Manley at the 2003 American Numismatic Association convention for a sum reported to be between \$2.5 and \$3 million. In April 1997, the Eliasberg 1804 dollar sold for \$1.815 million, an incredible record at the time.

Some of the same people who work for ANR now, were employed at Bowers' former firm and worked on the Eliasberg auctions of the 1990s. Richard Bagg did research and was involved in organizing the events. The current president of ANR, Christine Karstedt, coordinated public relations and advertising. The current ANR photographer, Douglas Plasencia, was also in charge of photography then.

Once again, Q. David Bowers will be the chief cataloger of an Eliasberg sale. John Krajelvich and Frank Van Valen will be major catalogers. Outside experts will also contribute.

Other than Bowers, Richard Bagg will be the only person to have been involved in the selling of the Eliasberg collection in three different decades.

Although Eliasberg's world coins were included in displays of his collection in the 1960s and '70s, few collectors remember the details now. Before the Eliasberg auctions of U.S. coins, it was widely known that all the great rarities were included. In contrast, a tremendous amount of suspense is building in the numismatic community regarding the contents of the Eliasberg world coin collection.
