The Edmonton Numismatic Society

The Edmonton Numismatic Society (ENS) dates back to September 1953. At that time the members met and discussed the hobby under the name, the Edmonton Coin Club. During the 1960's, 70's, and 80's the Club sponsored 20 Annual Coin-A-Rama shows, issuing many collectible souvenirs.



In 1979, The City of Edmonton's 75th Anniversary, the Club was host to its first CNA Convention. A number

of mini shows and Anniversary shows were held during the 1980's and 90's. As a reflection of the varied collecting interest of the current membership, and a continuing commitment to promote the hobby, the Club changed its name to the Edmonton Numismatic Society just prior to hosting its second CNA Convention in 1998. Since 1996 the Club has sponsored two shows each year, one in the late winter/early spring and one in the fall.

ENS MARCH SHOW REPORT

The ENS March 19 & 20th show is now history, and another successful show was had by all. This show's special guests were Kyle Mutcher and his father Otto and mother. They provided demonstrations all weekend long on striking tokens in the roman style. They used a sledge hammer with a special custom designed anvil and dies to strike the tokens. This was very well received by the public who were allowed to watch and have tokens struck especially for them. Thanks are extended to Kyle and his parents for their great work during the show. The Sunday moring breakfast meeting was well attended with 45 members and guests, and Kyle explained the process and reasons for doing what he does. He presented special tokens in cases to Charles Moore, CNA President, Dan Gosling, ENS President, and Harve Gamer, Calgary. The show was attended by 37 dealers from across Canada including 2 from the US. The following is a summary of Show Attendance:

Saturday – Presales attending – 90; Tickets at the door – 194; Juniors – 24; Dealers – 51. Total 359 Sunday – Presales attending – 69; Tickets at the door – 101; Juniors – 27; Dealers – 51. Total 248 Total Attendance for the 2 days was 607.

<u>100th Anniversary Token Struck at Edmonton's</u> <u>Money Show</u>

To commemorate the 100th Anniversary of Alberta, the ENS (Edmonton Numismatic Society) authorized the striking of a commemorative token. The token was struck in the Roman style, using hand engraved dies and a sledgehammer. The die maker and striker is Kyle Multcher of Four Corners Coin & Currency, Winnipeg. Kyle, along with his sledgehammer wielding father, Otto, have been doing this for a couple of years now, starting with the creation of the 50th Anniversary Manitoba Coin Club medallion in 2004. The metal for the blanks is obtained from scrap coins and jewellery and melted into small balls, then flattened, and subsequently struck using dies that Multcher himself engraves by hand. The dies are put together with a blank between them and struck with a sledgehammer. Kyle holds onto the dies, as his father hits them with the sledgehammer. Trust and a steady hand, has a lot to do with why Kyle's father swings the sledgehammer. The irregular shape of these hand struck tokens appear rather crude. This method of hand striking simulates the way ancient coins were minted 2000 or more years ago. Collectors today find this process very interesting as it gives them insights into the problems and variations that occur in the minting of their ancient coins. Several coin dealers at the show were intrigued enough with the demonstration to provide Kyle with silver and gold coins, both ancient and modern, to use as blanks and some interesting overstrikes were produced.

The ENS is producing 100 of these commemorative tokens, and will be available for sale, on a first come, first served basis.

Specifications: Sterling Silver (0.925 Ag, 0.075 Cu) Approximate size: 1" in diameter 100 Tokens will be struck, with a \$12 denomination. Cost: \$12 per token at the show. After the show, \$12 plus shipping & handling OBVERSE: Edmonton Numismatic Society Logo with \$12 denomination beside the gold nuggets REVERSE: Alberta 1905 – 2005 around the edge, with Alberta's motto "Fortis et Libre" above the dates. The field shows the Alberta mountains, foothills and wheat in the foreground.

Talk by Society member *Terry Cheesman* on Ancient coins. 30 lot auction

EARL JOSEPH SALTERIO

1934 - 2005

Earl Joseph Salterio, F.C.N.A., F.C.N.R.S., Knight of St. Eligius, Knight of Columbus Fourth Degree and beloved husband of Esther Salterio of Calgary, passed away on Tuesday, March 1, 2005 at the age of 70 years.

Earl was born in Saint John, NB on May 26, 1934. He graduated from St. Vincent's Boys High School, later attending Saint Thomas University in Chatham, prior to joining the Bank of Nova Scotia in Fredericton in 1961, which began his interest in numismatics. He served in various branches in New Brunswick and Calgary before retiring on February 28, 1993.

A devoted Roman Catholic, he was very active in the Diocese of Calgary, having served on the Bishop's Diocesan Finance Council and the Board of the Priests' Retirement Residence. Earl served his parish of Sacred Heart as Eucharistic Minister and in the capacity of Acolyte/Sacristan at parish funerals.

Earl was very active in the hobby of numismatics and received numerous prestigious awards. He was President of the Fredericton Numismatic Society in 1980. In 1981, Earl was transferred to Calgary as a manager with the Bank of Nova Scotia. He joined the Calgary Numismatic Society in 1981 (# 601) and was First Vice-President in 1982 and 1983. He was elected President of the club in 1984. He later served on the Calgary club's executive as a Director in 1987, Secretary in 1988, First Vice-President in 1994, President again in 1995 and a Director again from 2000 through 2004. He also served on many Calgary Numismatic Society Coin Show committees, including being Show Chairman in 1985 and the Professor A.R. Prince Memorial Award for Best of Show at the 1986 and 1999 Calgary club's Coin Shows. He was co-designer of the 1987 Canadian Numismatic Association Convention medal. Earl was presented with Honorary Life Membership # 13 in the Calgary Numismatic Society in 1998.

Earl was very active with the Canadian Numismatic Association, serving on its executive from 1987 to 1993, first as Second Vice-president, next as First Vice-president. He was CNA President from 1991 to 1993. He was also the American Numismatic Association's Country Ambassador to Western Canada for many years.

Earl received the Canadian Numismatic Association's 1994 Guy Potter Literary Award, the same year he was appointed a Fellow of the Canadian Numismatic Association (F.C.N.A.). He served as the CNA's Golden Anniversary Chairman for the Fiftieth Anniversary Convention in 2000, for his work on which he received a CNA Presidential Citation. Earl received the prestigious J. Douglas Ferguson Award, the highest award of the Canadian Numismatic Association, in the year 2000. He was also presented with an American Numismatic Association Presidential Award for "Outstanding Contributions to the ANA and the Coin Collecting Community". It was presented to him by A.N.A. President Robert Campbell.

Earl also served the CNA at various times as a member of the Coin Week Canada committee, Club Services Chairman, and the Awards and Medals Chairman.

Earl wrote a number of well-researched articles on subjects previously untouched by other writers, such as his articles on R. B. Bennett and his contributions to numismatics and education, and the Canadian Numismatic Arts Society. He spoke at the 1995 CNA Educational Forum in Calgary on the subject "Rt. Hon. R.B. Bennett: His Contribution to Numismatics".

Earl served on the board of the J. Douglas Ferguson Historical Research Foundation, of which he became the Treasurer. He also served as one of the judges for the Canadian Numismatic Research Society's literary award. He was a Past-President of the Canadian Association of Wooden Money Collectors. He was also President of the Canadian Paper Money Society from 2001 to 2003, and, at the time of his passing, was the Prairies And N.W.T. Regional Director of C.P.M.S. and the Co-chairman of the Canadian Numismatic Association's 2005 Convention in Calgary.

Paul Berry, Chief Curator of the National Currency Collection, Bank of Canada, paid the following tribute to Earl Salterio: "I am so sorry to hear about Earl's passing. I for one will certainly miss his presence at the conventions and in particular his warm manner of greeting friends that can be best described as a jovial conviviality. I will remember him as a kind, friendly fellow that gave of himself to help others. A knowledgeable numismatist, his deep voice, white hair and kind face gave him an air of authority, trust and wisdom one would more associate with the religious or legal profession. No doubt it was these attributes that led Earl to say grace at most convention gatherings where meals were served and caused Earl to be appointed a judge at the mock trial of Louis Riel during the 1985 (CNA) convention in Regina. He will be sorely missed!"

Earl will be sadly missed by his many friends, associates and colleagues in banking, numismatic, fraternal and church circles. He is survived by his beloved wife Esther, his two sons and daughters-in-law, Dr. Stephen Earl and Leslie Salterio of Kingston, Ontario, and John Paul and Christine Salterio of Halifax, Nova Scotia, together with grandchildren Alexander Leo of Kingston and Nicholas Reynold of Halifax, his sister Florence Hamrick of Texas, and many cousins in Canada and the United States. He was predeceased by his father and mother, Earl Reginald and Rosamond Veronica (nee Matthews) of Saint John, NB.




