#### The Edmonton Numismatic Society

The Edmonton Numismatic Society (ENS) dates back to September 1953. At that time the members met and discussed the hobby under the name, the Edmonton Coin Club. During the 1960's, 70's, and 80's the Club sponsored 20 Annual Coin-A-Rama shows, issuing many collectible souvenirs.

In 1979, The City of Edmonton's 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary, the Club was host to its first CNA Convention. A number

of mini shows and Anniversary shows were held during the 1980's and 90's. As a reflection of the varied collecting interest of the current membership, and a continuing commitment to promote the hobby, the Club changed its name to the Edmonton Numismatic Society just prior to hosting its second CNA Convention in 1998. Since 1996 the Club has sponsored two shows each year, one in the late winter/early spring and one in the fall.

#### **EXECUTIVE MEETING NOTES**

On April 28, 2005, the ENS executive met at the home of Terry Cheesman to discuss the affairs of the ENS. The following members were in attendance: Dan Gosling, Ray Neiman, Terry Cheesman, James Kindrake, Howard Gilbey, Dave Coupland and Michael Schneider. The following is a summary of the discussions and decisions made on behalf of the membership:

- The Calgary Numismatic Society has requested the CNS and the ENS produce a joint token/medallion to be issued to commemmorate the provinces 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. They would like it to be available for the CNA in Calgary in July. In addition, the ENS may consider producing a wood in lieu of the above.
- The September meeting will once again be a pizza night meeting.
- June Bar-B-Que location has changed. See June's newsletter for location.
- The next Executive meeting will be held August 25<sup>th</sup> at Jamie Horkulak's house.
- The official new name of the ENS newsletter will be 'The Planchet'
- The club is finalcially sound. The executive have agreed to donate \$300 to the Friends of the Museum, for allowing us to use the Museum to meet in; \$750 honourarium will be paid to the Kids on Coins program to cover expenses to the end of the year; \$1000 GIC will be purchased to add to our current \$13,000 GIC fund.
- CNA Delegate will once again be given an honouraruim to attend
  the conference in Calgary. Howard Gilbey has agreed to represent us
  and Albert Meyer will also be given a similar amount to attend the
  ANA this year.
- Discussion regarding the status of the Kids on Coins program in relation to the ENS was held, and it was agreed to help the Kids on Coins program become a not-for profit society, similar to the ENS. This would make it easier for the program to opperate. The ENS would still be a major supporter of the organization.
- A member requested another book donation to the U of A. However, it was agreed to hold this item over to the next meeting.

Thanks were given to Terry for his hospitality in holding the meeting at his house.

#### The Coinage of Suriname

James gave another of his usual enlightening and interesting talks at the April meeting. Using handouts and samples of coins from his personal type collection, James introduced most of the members to the geography, history, and numismatic variances of this small independent South American country.

Topics covered during the presentation included:

- 1. The Netherlands homeland coinage during World War II.
- 2. The decimal coins of the pre-independence (pre 1975) and post independence modern era including denominations, dates of issue, and metallic content.
- 3. The commemorative coins of the post independence era.
- 4. The commemorative coins of the post revolutionary (post 1980) period.
- 5. The commemorative coins of the Olympic Games and other world events.
- 6. The change in denomination use between Gulden and Guilders.

The talk was well received by all the members in attendance.

#### Alberta's Commemorative Centennial Medallion

In 2005, Alberta will honour the contributions of its oldest citizens and acknowledge the promise of its youngest with commemorative Centennial Medallions.

A brass medallion will be given to all Alberta school children during the centennial year. A special 14-karat gold version will be presented to Albertans who are D0 or older in 2005. It's expected that about 600 Albertans will meet the criteria for the gold medallion.

The front of the medallion illustrates Alberta's natural beauty, its people, its heritage and its many gifts. The graphics convey a sense of movement and signify a province in motion. The back of the medallion features Alberta's coat of arms. Both sides are encircled by a "100-point star" – a ring that represents the province's centennial.

Similar medallions were also presented in 1955 and in 1980 to commemorate the  $50^{\rm th}$  and  $75^{\rm th}$  anniversaries of our province.




