The Edmonton Numismatic Society

The Edmonton Numismatic Society (ENS) dates back to September 1953. At that time the members met and discussed the hobby under the name, the Edmonton Coin Club. During the 1960's, 70's, and 80's the Club sponsored 20 Annual Coin-A-Rama shows, issuing many collectible souvenirs. In 1979, The City of Edmonton's 75th Anniversary,



the Club was host to its first CNA Convention. A number

of mini shows and Anniversary shows were held during the 1980's and 90's. As a reflection of the varied collecting interest of the current membership, and a continuing commitment to promote the hobby, the Club changed its name to the Edmonton Numismatic Society just prior to hosting its second CNA Convention in 1998. Since 1996 the Club has sponsored two shows each year, one in the late winter/early spring and one in the fall.

Minutes, ENS Monthly meeting, Feb. 8 2005

Call to order: 7:34P.M., with 31 members in attendance.

President Jamie Horkulak announced that a table has been set aside in the other room as a bourse table for club members. Members are encouraged to bring in their spares or extras for sale. Jamie also reminded the membership that the club Auction will be occurring during the April meeting, and put the call out for consignments; - the earlier the better, - as we would like to be able to publish the list of consignments before the auction date.

The membership was also reminded that March is the cut-off date for membership renewals. Renewals are only \$12.00 per year, and represent a great buy for all you get. To those who haven't renewed, - please renew today! To those that have, -our thanks for your continued support!

Ron Derbyshire spoke about his recent trip to Cuba. He went to Varedaro and Matanzas and spoke to a couple of schools there. He reports that the students of the schools he spoke at were very enthusiastic on the topic of coins. He spoke for $3 \frac{1}{2}$ hours at one school on the topic of Canadian coins! He reports that he was relieved of all the Canadian change in his pockets, but did return home with a nice book on Cuban Coins that was given to him by one of the kids!

Ray Neiman brought some "show and tell" to share with the membership; - he brought in a lot of cigarette cards that he recently rediscovered. These cards all dated from the turn of the last century, - circa 1895 and about 1910. Most of the cards came out of packages of "Ogden's Guinea Gold" cigarettes, and were used as stiffeners in their soft packs. The images depicted various celebrities of the day, ranging from sports figures to politicians and theatre actors. He also brought in some "silks", which were along the same idea, but had some colour to them. All of these articles are quite rare, and although they are not related to numismatics, are quite collectable and highly sought after by specialized collectors. Ray was thanked for his presentation.

Jamie Horkulak mentioned that he has a Torex Show catalogue for the February 24-29 show, in case anyone was interested; he mentioned that there were some interesting "halves" going up for auction.

The feature presentation of the evening was presented by Eric Jensen, on the topic of "The Making of Alberta Medallions and Similar Stuff". He spoke at length about what it took him and his co-author, Alf Wrigley to publish the reference book "Alberta Medallions and Similar Stuff". They started in 1985-86 with just an idea; he explained the making of the first edition, which consisted of 304 illustrations at 111 pages, to the book it is today, with 2058 images and 730 pages. Mr. Jensen explained his criteria for inclusion to his catalogue, as well as his philosophy surrounding supplements and marketing, plus the rewards he realized during this experience. All in all it was a very informative talk, and the membership thanked Mr. Jensen for his presentation. A short coffee break ensued, with 6 members being awarded door prizes, and the second presentation of the evening was "An Introduction to Canadian Paper Money Part 2", done by Dan Gosling and read by Pierre Driessen. This presentation was part 2 of last month's presentation, and was just as well illustrated as last month's one was. The slide show consisted of a lot of Chartered notes, as well as some nice specimens of some early Dominion and Bank of Canada notes. The membership expressed its appreciation to both Dan and Pierre for a job well done. Following the meeting, 13 members continued the fellowship at the Boston Pizza on 124th street.





NEWFOUNDLAND VICTORIA 1882H SPECIMEN SET



12871 Newfoundland Victoria 1882H Specimen Set, the complete coinage for this date struck at the Heaton Mint featuring (all PCGS): KM2 5 Cents Specimen 62, KM3 10 Cents Specimen 62, KM4 20 Cents Specimen 62, KM6 50 Cents Specimen 62 and KM5 Gold 2 Dollars Specimen 60. All of the silver coins are choice, lightly toned examples which would appear to be significantly nicer than Specimen 62. The toning on each silver coin is light and attractive. The Gold 2 Dollars has a choice, prooflike reverse, but the obverse appears to have been cleaned at one time and is now toned. The rarity of this set cannot be overstated; it is the first we have seen offered. The legendary Belzberg Collection had only the 5 Cents and 2 Dollars in Specimen. The competition for this classic Canadian rarity should be intense. (Total: 5 Coins) Estimate: \$15,000-\$20,000


