Minutes, ENS General Meeting, May 10, 2006

Meeting was called to order at 7:35pm, with 23 members in attendance, and President Jaime Horkulak in the chair. Jaime noted that the BBQ will be on JUNE 11, 2006, at his place, instead of Jim Kindrake's place. More details to follow in the June "Planchet". Members who haven't already reserved a spot at the BBQ will be contacted by Terry Cheesman. RSVP deadline for the BBQ will be a week before the event.

For the members who chose to come to the meeting tonight, (and passed on an exciting hockey game), David Peter put together a nice presentation on "Canadian Specimen Notes". Mr. Peter stated that specimen notes have only been readily available for the past 7 years or so, prior to that they hardly ever were released to the public and rarely changed hands. Specimen notes were usually made in numbered sets and distributed to Canadian and foreign banks, government departments, foreign affairs, and the RCMP by the Bank Of Canada to show them what our currency looks like, or to demonstrate the various security devices our money has. There are a limited number of sets available, as no one is really sure how many were made, and the eventual disposition of most of the sets. The Bank of Canada started making sets as far back as 1935, and has made sets of specimen notes with every new banknote release. Mr. Peter described many of the different types, and brought along a fair amount from his own collection to show.

Our second speaker of the evening was Mr. Markus Molenda, who spoke on "Counterstamps of the Mexican Insurgence, 1811-14." Mr. Molenda put on a very interesting slide presentation detailing the various stamped and counterstamped coinage from the Mexican Insurgence. One was left with the impression that every time the coin was questioned and brought into any kind of an authority, it was deemed "good" and counterstamped. Mr. Molenda indicated that there were an incredible number of stamped and counterstamped coins issued, and that one could probably collect them for the rest of one's life and still not get a complete set together. He also stated that the coins can run the entire price spectrum from cheap to very expensive. He explained that his interest was triggered by a Canadian token that looked very much like one of the Mexican ones.

After a short question and answer period, door prizes were drawn, and the meeting was adjourned, and everyone fled in a hurry to catch the remainder of game 3. Approximately 10 members continued on to the Boston Pizza on 124th to continue the fellowship and to watch the Oilers squeak by the Sharks in three periods of overtime.

Subject: "MOUNTIE MONEY" - 3:30 p.m. start

Speaker: Chris Boyer, Waterloo, ON

The image of the Canadian Mountie is one of the most recognizable throughout the world. Not surprisingly, the theme of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police has appeared on Canadian coins, medals, tokens and banknotes. It is also amazing to see that many items, such as Dudley Do-Right tokens and other unusual material have been issued in the United States.

Have you seen a Canadian Mountie on a hobo nickel, or a Long Service medal? How about a challenge coin from the R.C.M.P.? Using numerous close-up images of these and other fascinating numismatic related items featuring "Mountie Money." Chris will recount the colourful history of the Force from its formation in 1873 to modern-day policing.

Chris Boyer is a Fellow of the Canadian Numismatic Association and is one of the authors of the CNA Numismatic Correspondence Course — Part II. He has held offices in the Ontario Numismatic Association (Area 5 Director) as well as the CNA as Youth Director. Chris has served as General Chairman of the 1999 CNA Convention and designed their convention medal. He is a recipient of the ONA "Fellow of the ONA" award (1996), the Royal Canadian Mint Youth Award (1995 and 1996) and the ONA "Award of Merit" in 2002. He has enter numerous award winning CNA exhibits on the topic of the RCMP in recent years. His feature article entitled "Mountie Money," appeared in the September, 2005 issue of "The ANA Numismatist." Chris has also designed a number of coins on behalf of the RCMP. A frequent speaker at local coin clubs, Chris is an elementary teacher at Franklin Public School where he runs a popular coin club for young collectors.

Subject: "PARALLELS IN NORTH AMERICAN BANKING: THE CANADIAN – AMERICAN EXPERIENCE" - 4:15 p.m. start

Speaker: Wendell Wolka, Greenwood, Indiana

This presentation will explore the many similarities, in both approach and timeline, between the Canadian and American banking systems from the late eighteenth century to the early decades of the 20th century. Numerous examples of both Canadian and American paper money, along with the stories behind their issuance, will be used to illustrate and explore this fascinating area of Canadian and American numismatics.

Wendell Wolka has been collecting a wide range of numismatic items for nearly 50 years. In addition to medals and coins of Martin Luther and the Protestant Reformation, Wendell collects Ohio obsolete bank notes. Ohio small size national bank notes, and a variety of world paper money including Canadian Chartered Bank notes. He has served in a number of positions with organizations including the Society of Paper Money Collectors, the Central States Numismatic Society, the Ohio State Numismatic Association and also the American Numismatic Association as an Instructor at the annual Summer Seminar each July in Colorado Springs. Wendell is honored to have received the Krause Publications Numismatic Ambassador Award, ANA Presidential Award, and the Society of Paper Money Collectors' 2005 Founders Award. He is a frequent educational speaker and has served as Master of Ceremonies for numerous numismatic events over the years. Wendell has authored a catalogue of Ohio obsolete paper money and co-authored a similar work covering the state of Indiana.

Moderator: Paul Johnson, Unionville, ON

Paul Johnson has planned the annual C.N.A. Educational Forums held in conjunction with the annual C.N.A. Conventions since 1983.

He has been involved with educational projects for the Canadian Numismatic Association for the past 18 years. He was Coordinating Editor of the CNA Numismatic Correspondence Courses Parts I and II released in 1995 and 2005, respectively, Chairman of the Young Numismatists Committee and, since 1991, Chairman of the CNA Education Committee. Paul has also been the Planning Chairman of the annual CNA one-day courses held at Humber College in Toronto each year since 1997 and spearheaded projects that resulted in the completion of the "CNA Club Organizational Handbook" and the "CNA Exhibits and Judging in Numismatics Handbook."






