#### **The Edmonton Numismatic Society**



#### UNUSUAL CANADIAN GOLD COINS AT HERITAGE AUCTION

Some sharp-eyed Canadian collectors were puzzled over the latest Canadian gold coins being auctioned on eBay from the February 2008 Heritage Long Beach Auction. Even more amazing, is that these "gold coins" were attributed by Numismatic Guaranty Corporation (NGC). The items up for auction were (shown here with Heritage Auction site descriptions):

Canada 1849 1/4 Dollar Liberty Head Gold MS62 NGC. Gold, 0.54 gm. 1849-dated Canada 25 cents Liberty Head RGT-with shield.





1849 Canada One Dollar Gold, MS62 NGC. Gold. Liberty head type with reverse shield.





British Columbia 1849 Gold 2 Dollar MS62 NGC. Gold. Two dollar British Columbia gold with reverse eagle and shield.





Actually, these three pieces are considered to be 'Canadian Gold Jewelers Pieces' and were minted by Jacoby Brothers Limited, Manufacturing Jewelers. They were often made into brooches, earrings, tiepins, bracelets, or some other form of jewelry. The pieces are typically 9K to 10K gold.

There appears to have been little numismatic interest, past or present, in these pieces in Canada. They occasionally show up on auction lists, but surprisingly appear more often in the United States. As to rarity, one can only hazard a guess. Obviously "mint" records are not available. However, Greene and Locke (2001) mention that typical orders were for 1000 large pieces, 500 smaller pieces and that multiple orders would have been received per year. The dies were used over a period of decades so it is possible that the mintages of some varieties could have been in the tens of thousands. At least 114 varieties of British Columbia gold jewelers pieces are known.

Several Canadian collectors contacted Heritage Auctions and received this reply:

"Unfortunately, the lots for Heritage tokens and medals auction #462 were put into the wrong category on eBay. The lots should have gone into the euxonomia category. As you can see from the online Heritage version of the lot, the items are listed under the category "California Gold Charms" and the auction is intended for tokens and medals only."

It is not unusual that auction lots containing these pieces often have erroneous statements in their listings (e.g., 1990 CNA Auction). However, the attribution, grading and designation of these coins being described as Canada or British Columbia issues by NGC is the real jaw-dropper.

#### **George Manz Coin Auctions presents Auction #4**

ENS member George Manz has announced that the Regina Coin Club's Spring Show will be the venue for the fourth in a series of auctions by George Manz Coin Auctions. The auction includes Part I of the George Manz Senior Collection (the father of the auctioneer who passed away in 1971) as well as Part III of the Roy Miller Collection.

The first lot at auction among the 194 lots is a denarius of Severus Alexander, who ruled Rome from 222-235. In EF condition, the silver coin is expected to sell for \$250. Another ancient coin of note is a Chinese Chou Dynasty Pu Spade issued 1122-255 BC. World coins include a beautifully toned 100 pesetas from Equatorial Guinea depicting Goya's famous painting of a nude woman, a French Crusader coin struck for Charles II of Anjou in the 13th century, a British 1911 half penny in MS-65 Red, an Irish 1822 penny from the Bud Collins Collection of Irish Coins, and a square 1920 cent from the Straits Settlements. A small number of U.S. coin lots are also offered, including a 1990 one-ounce Walking Liberty Silver Eagle with premium quality toning, estimated to sell for \$30.

Many Canadian coins are included in the April 19th auction in Regina, including numerous ICCS certified and graded coins. Among the highlights is an 1859 Double Punched Narrow 9 Variation graded VF-30 by ICCS. This variety is not listed in either Charlton or in Trends. The coin is estimated to sell for \$300. One of the prettier coins at auction is a 1973 specimen dollar celebrating the 100th anniversary of the North West Mounted Police. The reverse of this coin has outstanding toning and eye appeal and is graded SP-66, estimated to sell for \$30. Another lovely coin is a 2007 \$30 commemorating the Canadian National Vimy Ridge Memorial where four divisions of Canadian troops fought to victory in 1917. The auction also features a large assortment of Newfoundland coinage, including a rare 1899 Hooked 9s 20 cent, graded VG-8, expected to sell for \$45. A key date Nova Scotia 1862 cent, graded VG-10 by ICCS, is also for sale, with an estimated value of \$100.

A 1959 CNA Convention medal from Regina, the first CNA convention held outside Ontario, is expected to see spirited bidding. One of only 275 bronze medals struck, the scarce medal is shaped like a scallop. The medal is expected to sell for \$60. A large rectangular wooden nickel issued in Amsterdam, NY in 1954 and a love token carved on the reverse of a British 1843 groat (4 pence) are also expected to see lively bidding.

Historical and commemorative medals are among the prominent features of the auction, including four 1936 Edward VIII pattern crowns from British East Africa, Ceylon and New Guinea. Also at auction are three Canadian medals from the Great Canadians Series, including Samuel de Champlain and Emily Carr, both of which exhibit ultra heavy cameos and outstanding multi-colour obverse toning. American medals include a 56mm bronze1934 Centenary of Maryland medal and a Loyal Order of Moose medal from Grand Rapids, Michigan.

American paper money includes an obsolete Citizens' Bank of Louisiana \$5 CINQ note, a close cousin of the more famous \$10 DIX notes, after which the land of Dixie or Dixieland is named. A Royal Bank of Canada 1935 \$10 note with large signatures is also for sale, estimated to sell for \$275. Canadian paper money includes an 1878 \$1, numerous shinplasters, and a large number of replacement notes and radars. A 1973 \$1 error note that was cut out of register and cut off size is expected to sell for \$100. A lot of two specimen notes with the same serial numbers from the Pacific island of Tonga is also at auction, as is a lot of six stock certificates issued to Roy Miller in the 1950s and 1960s.

A collection of flags from the Roy Miller Collection and a large set of 315 Harley-Davidson sports cards that depict its history and motorcycles will also go under the gavel. Numismatic books and catalogues round out the auction, including the first part of the George Manz Senior Collection. Included are a Third Edition of Jim Charlton's 1955 Catalogue of Canadian Coins, Tokens & Fractional Currency as well as several catalogues written by Hans Zoell.

The auction will take place at the Regina Coin Club's Spring Show on April 19 at the Western Christian College gymnasium in Regina. Lots can be viewed in the bourse from 10:00 am to 6:00 pm, while the auction begins at 7:00 pm. #### HOARD OF GAULISH COINS DISCOVERED IN FRANCE

#### French News, 18 February 2008

France's biggest trove of Gaulish coins has been unearthed in Brittany. Archeologists found them while searching along the route of a bypass under construction in the Côtes d'Armor. The coins are in the hands of specialist restorers and will go on display in the department. The trove consists of 545 gold-silver-copper coins: 58 staters and 487 quarterstaters. 'Stater' is the generic term for antique coins. They lay a foot beneath the earth's surface near Laniscat, 64km south of Saint-Brieuc, at a known Iron Age manor house or farm site, and date to 75- 50BC. They are very well preserved.

Inrap, the national institute for preventive archeological research, which has the right to investigate sites ahead of infrastructure work, reports similar finds in the 1930s at Guingamp and Perros-Guirec, but says the latest trove is the biggest yet. Searching ahead of construction work, an Inrapled

team found a single coin about 30cm down, and then began a systematic search. They found another 50 coins the same day, then brought in metal detectors and found the rest. They believe the coins were all buried together but were disturbed over the centuries by ploughing. The hoard represents a fortune for its period and is priceless to archeologists. Most deals in Gaulish times were by barter: coins were for the mega-rich.

The farm where the coins were found is thought to have belonged to the Osisme people, a Celtic tribe living in the far west of Brittany. Inrap quotes Pytheas of Marseille, a Greek seafarer who left Marseille in about 300BC for Great Britain, as mentioning the tribe living at the tip of the peninsula. Inrap cites Léon Fleuriot, 1923-87, a specialist in old Celtic languages and Breton history, as stating that the word Osisme meant "the people farthest away". Latest archeological finds, says Inrap, show that the Osisme people ruled a territory comprising today's Finistère, Morbihan and Côtes d'Armor, controlling the overland trade route between

the Atlantic and the Channel. The coins are made from an alloy called electrum and, like all Gaulish coins. are copies of early Greek money. Greeks served as mercenaries the armies in Alexander the Great and used the money they brought home as a model for coins of their own. Some of the coins show a horse on one side and a man's head on the reverse, a familiar Celtic monetary pattern. coins have Other previously unknown designs, such as horses



with human heads. Others again show riders and wild boars.





Much of the importance of the find is that it was discovered close to where it was buried. The manor house site, dating to the third century BC, includes an enclosure marked off by a ditch and rampart, less for defence than as boundary markers, with six entrance porches. Part of the enclosure holds a grain store raised above ground. One mystery remains. No one yet has come up with a solution as to why the coin hoard was buried – or why it was never retrieved.


